Students will be learning that fractions represent a part of a whole or part of a set. The main fractions we will be working with are halves, thirds, fourths, sixths and eighths. This past week we have made fraction models and practiced dividing a shape into equal parts. We will also be covering equivalent fractions, fractions on a number line, line plots and comparing fractions.
	Please continue practicing basic (0–10) multiplication facts with vour child at home.
This Week in Language Arts This week we are starting Cycle 5. We will be reading mystery novels and learning the elements of a mystery. We will act as dectives as we try to figure out the problem or solve the crime before the characters in the books! In order to do that we must be caerful readers! Students will be paying attention to deail, making perdictions and inferences and analyzing our characters to see which one might be the suspect. We can't wait to see what kind of mysteries await us! In writing students are working on an independent persuasive essay topic. We are finishing our graphic organaizers and writing our own persuasive essay.
