Upon returning from Spring Break, we will be doing a CMS Word Problem mini-unit in class. We will be sending home Investigations Unit 8 as a homework contract. It will be due Friday, May 5<sup>th</sup>. In our mini-unit we will be working with multi-step word problems using all four operations (multiplication, division, addition, subtraction). We will be learning how to decompose and comprehend word problems. We will also write equations and correctly solve for the answer.
